

COPYRIGHT INFORMATION FOR AUTHORS

The U.S. copyright law effective January 1977 requires an explicit transfer of copyright from author to publisher (theretofore implicit in the submission of a manuscript) to enable the publisher to have consistent copyright protection and the right to disseminate the author's work. Therefore, each author is asked to execute and sign the following document and to submit it with the final manuscript.

If you wish your manuscript to be published in the annual publication of the Consortium on Revolutionary Europe, complete the form on this sheet and submit it with your final manuscript to the Chairman/Editor of the Consortium at which you presented it. These forms will be maintained on file by the editor-in-chief.

TRANSFER OF COPYRIGHT AGREEMENT

(Must be signed and returned before the manuscript can be published.)

When the article is accepted for publication I, as the author, hereby agree to transfer to the Consortium on Revolutionary Europe all rights under existing copyright laws except for the following:

1. The right to make further copies of the published paper for my use in classroom teaching;
2. The right to re-use all or part of this material in a compilation of my own work or in a textbook of which I am the author or co-author.
3. The right to make copies of the published article for internal distribution within the institution that employs me, or for other non-commercial, non-profit purposes that do not affect the potential market for or value of the article.

I agree that copies made under these circumstances, including translations and adaptations, will carry the copyright notice that appeared in the original published work, the annual volume of the Selected Papers of the Consortium on Revolutionary Europe, 1750-1850.
